

The Tuktuk Boys

Round the World by Piaggio



Rich Sears and Nick Gough who have both been teachers in Guildford in England arrived in Kenya in the Piaggio Tuk Tuk which they are driving around the world. So far they have covered a 16,000 kilometre leg from Britain through Europe, Egypt, the Sudan and Ethiopia.

They are attempting to break the Guinness world record for the longest journey in an auto-rickshaw and in the process raise 135 million shillings for the Global Campaign for Education. During their 14 month marathon three wheeler motoring adventure they are visiting needy schools along the route to assess their priority requirements. These are relayed to the Tuk Tuk Travels administration in Britain to invite sponsors to help underfunded schools in Africa, Asia and Latin America.

While in Nairobi Rich Sears and Nick Gough visited Car and General, the Kenya agent for Piaggio, for repairs and a service. The Car and General workshop staff were pleased and impressed that after a 16,000 kilometre journey which included 600 kilometres on very rough unsurfaced roads the Tuk Tuk's problems are only minor oil leaks and a fracture in the frame of the rear seat.
